Postdoctoral Position in Microeconomics/Behavioral Economics/Behavioral Finance

The <u>Chair of Economic Theory I</u> (Prof. Dr. Sebastian Ebert) at the Department of Economics invites applications for the position of a postdoctoral researcher. The position is available for a period of three years (extension up to three additional years possible). Research conducted at the chair focuses on various topics in microeconomics and finance. Both theoretical and empirical/experimental research is possible; the latter should be theory-driven.

The position includes a teaching obligation of at most 4 hours per week. Salaries are according to the German pay scale E13 and range from about 50.000 € to about 57.000 € per yearbefore taxes. Funds for travel, research support, and experiments are available.

Postdoctoral fellows will have the opportunity to do independent research in their respective fields. In addition, they are expected to actively interact with other researchers of the Department of Economics. The successful candidate should hold a PhD in economics or a related field. German language skills are not a requirement. As an equal opportunity employer, the University of Heidelberg actively encourages applications from women. Preference will be given to disabled applicants with equal qualifications.
