Areas of study <i>not</i> available to exchange students	<p>None, but at least half (50 % or more) of the course modules have to be within the Faculty of Science.</p> <p>Students are allowed to take cross-faculty modules but this is subject to approval by the course offering faculty/department.</p>
Level of courses	Exchange students are normally allowed to take courses on both bachelor (undergraduate) level and master (graduate) if requirements are met.
Full time course load per semester	30 credits (“hp”) per semester is considered full time. 60 hp per year. Maximum course load per semester is 30 credits plus one 7,5 credits Swedish (SVEE) course.
Language requirements	<p>It is important that you have sufficient proficiency in English language to be able to study the courses open to exchange students. It is <i>recommended</i> that you have a proficiency corresponding to IELTS 6.5 / TOEFL 90.</p> <p>Please check with your home university regarding the required levels to be nominated for an exchange to Lund University.</p>
Preparatory language courses for incomings available?	Yes, and it is for free.
