The Department of Economics at Heidelberg University, Germany, invites applications to fill the position of

Professor of Economics (W3) with a focus on Economic Theory.

The position will start in the Summer Semester 2021 or as early as possible thereafter.

The successful candidate is an expert in the area of economic theory, including applied theory. Applicants are expected to have excellent academic credentials and a proven commitment to research, reflected in relevant publications in leading international journals.

The Department of Economics is one of Germany's leading research-oriented departments. Among our most active research areas are Political & Public Economics, Development Economics, and Behavioral & Experimental Economics. The ideal candidate's research agenda has overlaps or complements one or several of these areas.

Teaching involves courses in the department's B.Sc. degree programme Economics (Political Economy) and the M.Sc. degree programme Economics (taught in English). The teaching load corresponds to the relevant regulations of the state of Baden-Württemberg. Teaching in English is possible.

In accordance with Article 47, paragraph 2 of the Higher Education Law of the state of Baden-Württemberg prerequisites for application are a university degree and doctoral degree, a Habilitation or a successfully evaluated junior professorship or equivalent qualifications. The University of Heidelberg aims to increase the share of female professors. We therefore especially welcome applications of qualified female academics. Disabled applicants will be preferred given otherwise equal qualifications for the position.
