The Shrinking Civic Space in India

Civic space in India has over the past few years shrunk rapidly. The impact of this has been felt widely across a spectrum of institutions and now encompasses activists, comedians, fact checkers, political leaders, civil society organisations and a range of institutions. The State capture of autonomous institutions and the media is near-complete. This lecture explores the evolving landscape particularly for NGOs and other civil society organisations and the trajectory so far.



Mr. Biraj Patnaik is the Executive Director of National Foundation for India - NFI. Prior to joining NFI, he was the South Asia Director of Amnesty International. He was formerly the Principal Adviser to the Commissioners of the Indian Supreme Court in the landmark 'right to food' case for close to a decade. A well-known human rights activist, he has been part of many national and global campaigns, including the right to food campaign in India. Biraj co-founded the 'Mitanin' community health worker program that trained and deployed 70,000 health workers in Chhattisgarh which was the precursor to the nation-wide ASHA community health worker program.
