



## FELLOWSHIPS AT THE W.F. ALBRIGHT INSTITUTE OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL RESEARCH IN JERUSALEM

The W.F. Albright Institute of Archaeological Research (AIAR) in Jerusalem is the oldest American research center for ancient Near Eastern studies in the Middle East.

Fellowships are open to students and scholars in Near Eastern studies from prehistory through the Medieval periods, including the fields of archaeology, anthropology, art history, Bible, epigraphy, historical geography, history, language, literature, philology and religion and related disciplines. The research period should be continuous, without frequent trips outside the country. Residence at the Albright is required.

### FELLOWSHIPS FOR ALL NATIONALITIES

#### **Lydie T. Shufro Summer Research Fellowship**

\$3,000 award for 1 month. Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month and the remainder is stipend.

Open to doctoral, post-doctoral, and senior scholars of all nationalities. This Fellowship is for a residential period between 1 June 2023 and 31 August 2024. Residency at the Institute in Jerusalem is required and no exceptions can be granted.

Close date: Nov 15 2022

#### **Marcia and Oded Borowski / Barton Research Fellowship**

\$12,000 award for 4 months. Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month and the remainder is stipend.

Open to all doctoral students and recent Ph.D. (degree granted within last 5 years) recipients of all nationalities. This Fellowship is for a residential period between 1 September 2023 and 31 May 2024. Residency at the Institute in Jerusalem is required and no exceptions can be granted.

Close date: Nov 15 2022

#### **Seymour Gitin Distinguished Professorship**

\$20,000 award for 4 months (two awards available). Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month and the remainder is stipend.

Open to internationally-recognized senior scholars of all nationalities that have made significant contributions to their field of study. This fellowship is for a residential period between 1 September 2023 and 31 May 2024. Residency at the Institute in Jerusalem is required and no exceptions can be granted.

Closing date: Dec 31 2022

#### **Sean W. Dever Memorial Prize**

This prize provides \$750 for the best paper presented at a conference which treats a topic in the field of Syro-Palestinian or Biblical Archaeology. Authors must be Ph.D. candidates in the



semester in which the winner is announced (Spring 2023). They may be of any nationality but the paper must be in English.

***Submissions must be conference papers not already published or prepared for submission to a publication.*** Co-written or co-presented pieces may be submitted if all the authors or presenters are doctoral candidates; the prize, if awarded, will be divided equally among authors or presenters.

All submissions must be in PDF format only. Submissions must be conference papers not already published or prepared for submission to a publication. Conference papers must include images (if used in the presentation) in PDF format (either as a separate document or embedded within the text of the paper), and full citations and bibliographic references.

### **The Palestine Exploration Fund / Albright Institute Fellowship in Jerusalem**

£3,000 award to support research that requires access to the PEF archives and collection and also time spent in residence at the Albright Institute in Jerusalem.

Open to all doctoral and post-doctoral researchers of all nationalities. This fellowship is for a residential period between 1 September 2023 and 31 May 2024. A minimum of 10 working days at the PEF in Greenwich, London, and 1 month minimum stay at the AIAR in Jerusalem is required. The room and half-board at the Institute (\$1,500 per month) will come from the award, with the rest being a flexible stipend for other activities. The working days at the PEF may be completed anytime from the granting of the award until 31 May 2024.

## **FELLOWSHIPS FOR US CITIZENS**

### **Carol and Eric Meyers ECA Doctoral Dissertation Fellowship**

\$12,000 award for 4 months. Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month and the remainder is stipend.

Open to doctoral students who are US Citizens. While all topics will be considered, those involving the study of archaeology and society at the household level are encouraged. This Fellowship is for a residential period between 1 September 2023 and 31 May 2024. Residency at the Institute in Jerusalem is required and no exceptions can be granted.

Close date: Nov 15 2022

### **Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA) Junior Research Fellowship**

\$12,000 award for 4 months (three awards available). Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month and the remainder is stipend.

Open to doctoral students and recent Ph.D. (degree granted within last 5 years) recipients who are US, Israeli, or Palestinian citizens. This Fellowship is for a residential period between 1 September 2023 and 31 May 2024. Residency at the Institute in Jerusalem is required and no exceptions can be granted.

Close date: Nov 15 2022



### **National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) Fellowship**

\$70,000 available for up to three awards from 4 to 6 months. The award is \$5,000 per month. Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month and the remainder is stipend. Open to post-doctoral scholars who are U.S. citizens (or alien residents for at least three years). Applicants must have completed all requirements, except for the actual conferral of the degree, by the application deadline for the fellowship. This Fellowship is for a residential period between 1 September 2023 and 31 May 2024.

### **FELLOWSHIPS FOR US, ISRAELI OR PALESTINIAN CITIZENS**

#### **US State Department Educational And Cultural Affairs (ECA) Annual Professorship**

\$13,500 award for 4 months. Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month and the remainder is stipend.  
Open to post-doctoral scholars who are also US, Israeli, or Palestinian citizens. The Annual Professor is expected to be a leader among the community of fellows, and mentor to younger fellows while in residence. As such, the recipient is expected to assist the Albright's Director in planning and implementing the US State Department Educational And Cultural Affairs (ECA) Program for Albright Fellows, and to organize informal events to build community among the residents. A working knowledge of living and traveling in Israel and Palestine is desirable. Contact the director with any questions related to the duties of the position. This fellowship is for a residential period between 1 September 2023 and 31 May 2024. Residency at the Institute in Jerusalem is required and no exceptions can be granted.
